To this end a series of Concerts of Spanish and English music has been inaugurated in London, two of which have already been given, prominent Spanish artists having been engaged to come over specially for each performance.

A sister Society has been formed in Madrid, which is already functioning, and Concerts are being arranged in which English composers and executants will take part, while tours are arranged for the English artists in Spain. When it is remembered that this movement will give recognition to our composers and work for our artists, not only in Spain but in Spanish speaking countries, it is evident that it is one that will benefit all members of the musical profession.

In order to make this great movement a success, we must have support; more than that, we want enthusiasm. Started by a Spanish artist for the benefit, not only of his compatriots, but chiefly for those of the country of his adoption, far less well known in Spain than Spanish artists are here, it is deserving of support from all those who have the interests of the musical profession at heart.
